Panama Update: \$180,675 Panama Clean Water Grant funding received by the Club! This second, follow-on project with Rotary Club of Panama Nordeste is now underway!



Grace Period update: On June 22, nearly a hundred Mbuyazwe Primary and Secondary School female students received menstrual kits containing reusable sanitary products and participated in a menstrual health education session. This Grace Period effort began with GRSP student Panashe Sivindani's idea and is a collaboration among Belmont Rotary, Roswell Rotary Club, and Days for Girls to tackle this issue to make sure that girls in Zimbabwe can go to school throughout the year and give them a chance to lift themselves out of poverty through education – One Girl at a Time!
