Jonathan, Darrell and I will be donating. Newer Rotarian Gabriel Prado has committed to making his first donation!

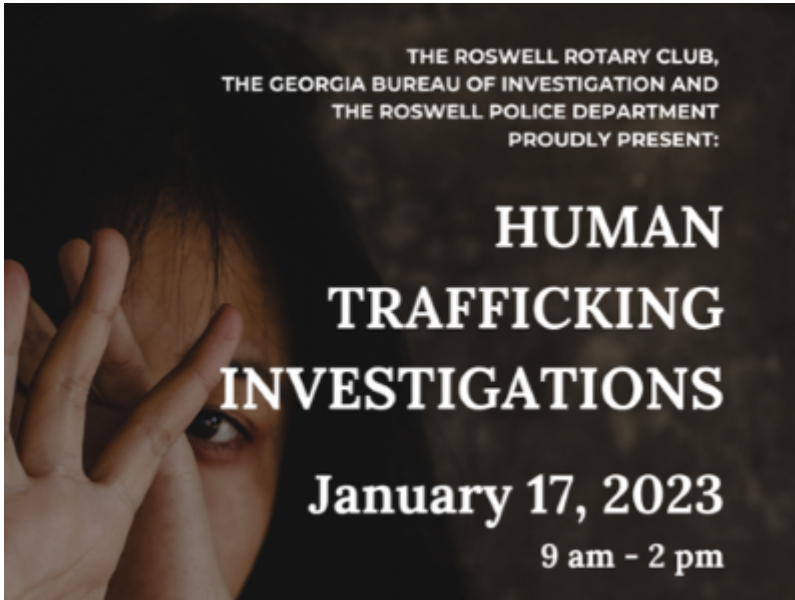
